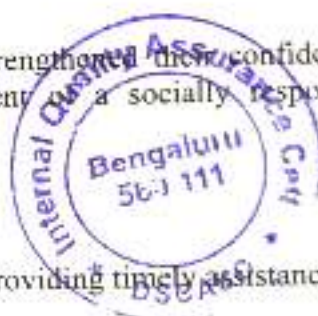
The workshop aimed to equip students with basic emergency response skills and knowledge to provide immediate assistance to road crash victims until professional medical help arrives. Participants learned about scene safety, basic first aid, emergency response procedures and the importance of timely intervention during accidents.

The workshop was facilitated by **Dr. Aarushi and Ms. Karthika, NIMHANS Coordinators** - served as the trainers for the session. They provided valuable insights on lay responder care for road crash victims, emphasizing the importance of timely intervention, scene safety and basic emergency response techniques. Through interactive discussions and practical demonstrations, the trainers effectively guided students on how to respond confidently and responsibly during road traffic emergencies, enhancing their preparedness to provide immediate assistance until professional medical help arrives.

The session enhanced students' awareness of road safety and strengthened their confidence to act responsibly during emergencies, contributing to the development of a socially responsible and prepared student community.

Objectives

1. To create awareness among students about the importance of providing timely assistance to road crash victims.
2. To equip participants with basic knowledge and skills required to respond effectively during road traffic emergencies.
3. To help students understand the role and responsibilities of a lay responder at an accident scene.
4. To promote safe and appropriate first-aid practices until professional medical assistance arrives.
5. To encourage responsible citizenship and confidence in assisting victims during emergency situations.
